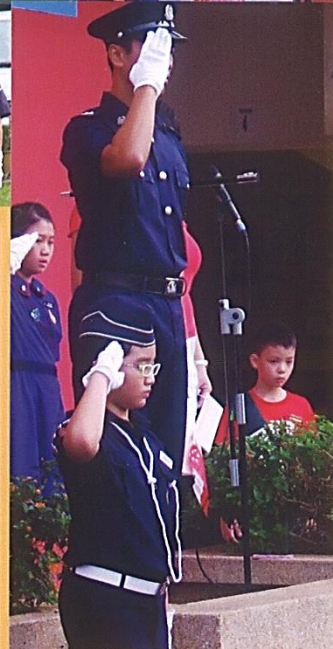
CAMP @ HOME

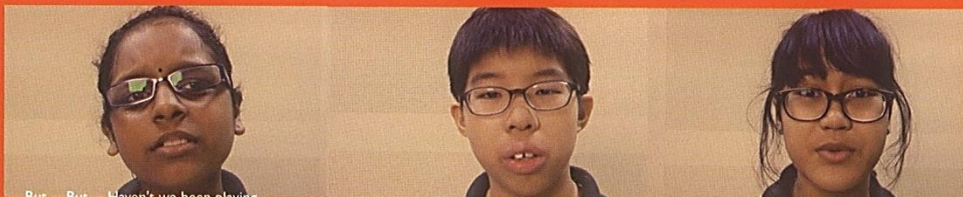
NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS

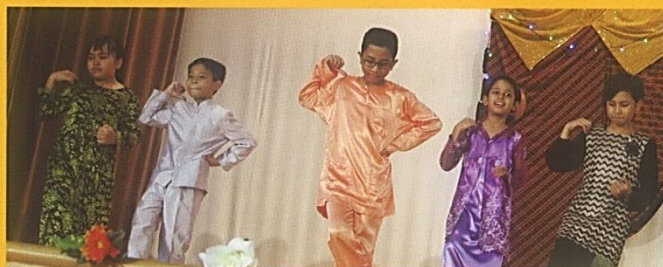
RACIAL HARMONY

HARI RAYA CELEBRATIONS

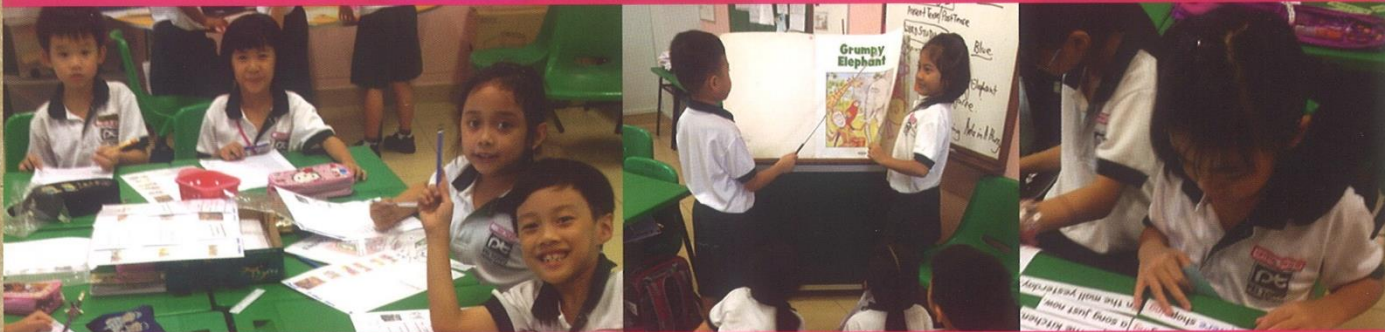

The effective guides of the farm made learning fun and really easy for the students. The students were even given the chance to hold and feel the frogs. Despite the initial hemming and hawing, everyone touched the frogs excitedly. Back in school, sans the frogs, the students got to rear their own mealworm beetles and butterflies. They were given the eggs and encouraged to observe their growth through the different stages. 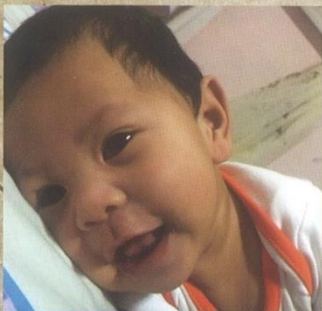

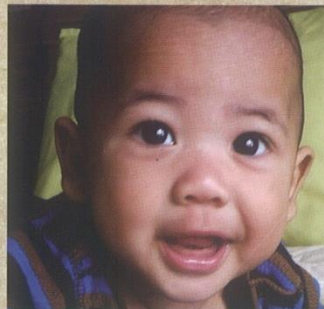
